Deep Orbital Surprise

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History and Symptoms

- 28-year-old man
- History of redness and discomfort in left eye
- Vision 20/20 in each eye
- Normal motility and alignment

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Orbital CT scsn

- Bony defect filled with lipid cystic mass
- Diagnosed as dermoid cyst
- Inflammatory reaction due to sebaceous content leakage

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Surgical Excision

- Mass excised
- Complete scraping of lateral bony pocket
- Diamond drilling for insuring complete cystic wall excision

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Conclusion

- Think of all possible differentials
- Deep orbital dermoid cysts require prompt attention
- Accurate diagnosis through imaging is crucial
- Surgical removal is usually the recommended approach
- Collaborative effort for optimal patient care

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
